### PCUSA INITIATIVE ON THE WELFARE OF CENTRAL AMERICAN MISSIONS

In 2014, the Reformed Calvinist Church of El Salvador (IRCES) embraced Christ's call to welcome the stranger, supporting unaccompanied minors deported to El Salvador, and later launching a shelter for returned migrants and internally displaced persons. But the church's vision goes beyond providing shelter, and yearns to transform our reality and address the root causes of migration. This vision is to make known the kin-dom of God through community development, respect for human rights, and a sense of rootedness and fellowship. Together, we can collaborate on migration issues in North and Central America to impact government policies, connect projects that support migrants, and integrate people into the social fabric.

In 2018, the PC(USA) committed to join our siblings in Central America and establish a mission network on migration in northern Central America. The day has now come to build this fellowship of leaders who believe in a God of life who desires welcome for migrants and who opposes the violence and poverty that forces them to flee their homes. From March 19-27, 2024, in San Salvador, El Salvador, IRCES will bring together organizations from Central and North America to launch this mission network. Together, we will learn from one another about migration, strengthen professional ties and fellowship, and advocate for change in public policy.

The 2022 report "Seeking Hope Amid Despair in Central America" calls on us:

"As our partners strive to reopen springs of hope, we whose lives are entwined with theirs seek to attend to both cries of lamentation and signs of the life-giving Spirit in our midst."

Through the birth of this mission network, we respond to these cries and "join the call of prophets and martyrs" to resist the "sinful status quo" that hurts our migrant siblings.
